

Final Examination:

A final exam will be scheduled during finals week. All must take the final. The final is worth 30% of your final grade and will concentrate on material covered in the last six weeks of the course.

Exam Policy:

Come to each exam with a minimum of belongings. Bring a hand calculator. You cannot use a cell phone as a calculator. I want all cell phones out of sight during each exam.
